RESIDENT VISITORS PERMIT TERMS AND CONDITIONS



CONDITIONS OF USE

- **The charge for a book of 5 visitor permits commencing 3rd April 2017 is £11.00**
- The permits do not guarantee the availability of a parking place.
- The One Day Parking Permits are only valid for use within the Parking Zone as shown on the permits. The permits allow all day parking where the signs indicate a 2 hour limit and that permit holders are exempt.
- The permits do not entitle you to park on yellow lines or other parking spaces.
- The permit is not valid for Council Housing Land. These permits need to be obtained separately from Poole Housing Partnership.
- No transfer or refund of any unused time, unused permit or incorrectly completed permits will be allowed. Only refunds for unused books will be allowed.
- The use of parking spaces may be suspended by Police Officers, Civil Enforcement Officers or duly authorised Council Officers.
- The user must ensure the vehicle is parked within the confines of the parking space.
- If your visitor permits are stolen, then replacements will be issued on production of a crime number from the Police to confirm the theft of the resident permit or vehicle. **Replacements for resident permits lost in other circumstances will not be issued.**
- The council reserves the right to withdraw any permits found to have been improperly issued or misused.
- Contravention of the above conditions will invalidate the card permit and the vehicle will be subject to the issue of a Penalty Charge Notice.
- Refunds will only be issued for full books of parking permits.
- Instructions on how to use and display your permit are set out on the scratch card supplied.
